## STRATEGIC POLICY

## POLICY

A strategic policy is an official statement of strategic direction the Association shall endeavour.

- (A) The policy may also be a singular action item versus a strategic direction.
- (B) A strategic policy shall serve as the guiding principles to any strategic plan.
- (C) Through a majority vote of the Board, may the President endorse a strategic policy.
  - (a) The president shall be granted the authority to endorse a strategic plan supporting a strategic policy.
- (D) It is recommended to consult with the Strategic Communication Advisor prior to the enactment of a strategic policy.

### PROCEDURE

- 1. In accordance with policy 0001-00.1 the strategic policy shall follow the same policy cycle.
  - 1. Identification of strategic actions or direction may come from the Delegation, Board or Executive;
  - 2. Consultation shall be at the discretion of the Board;
  - 3. The Board shall explore all viable options and develop a strategic policy;
  - 4. The Board shall vote on the strategic policy;
  - 5. The President shall endorse the strategic policy;
  - 6. Through the coordination fo the President, a strategic plan is developed to support the policy;
    - 1. Through a constituent policy appoint personnel to develop the strategic plan.
  - 7. At the discretion of the President, the implementation of the strategic policy and plan shall occur.
- 2. A strategic policy shall include the following components:

- 1. An <u>effective date</u> of when the policy shall take effect.
- 2. A <u>purpose statement</u>, outlining why the Association is issuing the policy, and what effect or outcome of the policy should be.
- 3. An <u>applicability and scope statement</u>, describing who the policy effects and which actions are impacted by the policy.
- 4. A <u>responsibilities statement</u>, describing who is responsible for carrying out the policy statement, the statement may also include any relevant oversight and/or governance structures.
